



IMMIGRATION SUSPENDED.

The Colonial Secretary, Mr. Malcolm
Mac Donald, announced in the House of Commons that, because of the recent influx
of illegal immigrants, no Jewish immigration quota will be issued for six months,
commencing from October 1939. "The British
Government", he said, "are determined to
prevent this attempt to defeat the laws of
Palestine - an attempt which is perpetuating
the bitterness in that country".

In order to overcome illegal immigration, the Colonial Secretary has suspended legal immigration thereby admitting the weakness of the administration. It is due to this very same weakness of the administration that the British Government has not fulfilled the terms of the mandate.

Continuing, Mr. MacDonald said, "Jewish leaders and Jewish people themselves who have the greatest control over this traffic, could reduce it greatly, and we are entitled to ask for their co-operation". To this the Jewish Agency replied that it refused to be made in any way responsible for the inevitable consequences of the Government's immigration policy. The statement says, "The Colonial Secretary is attempting to shift the

blame for the unfortunate results of his own restrictive immigration policy, on to the Agency".

Some years ago the Jewish people agreed to immigration being regulated by the economic absorptive capacity of Eretz Yisrael.

And so long as immigration is measured by the economic and not political standard organised Zionism will co-operate with the British Government.

The only way to stop illegal immigration is to allow legal immigration adequate to the needs of the Jewish people, regard being had to the economic absorptive capacity of the country. Failure to do this will merely increase the bitterness towards the Government. Moreover it will alienate still further Zionist co-operation, without which the British Government will never be able to enforce the laws of Palestine.

KOFER HAYISHUV.

The South African Zionist Youth Council has launched an undertaking to increase the interest of the Jewish public in the heroic defence of Eretz Yisrael and to raise money in support of security measures. In our homeland the Yishuv (Jewish settlements) has imposed upon itself a voluntary tax on the purchase of cigarettes, entertainment tickets, bus fares, etc.

with the Yishuv defence will be acclaimed on all sides, and in future, Zionist Youth revenues will be taxed for this purpose by affixing a Kofer Hayishuv stamp to all tickets, etc. These may

be had from all societies.

The normal rate of tax is one penny per shilling and the stamps have been issued in four denominations viz: ld., 3d., 6d., and l/-. Each stamp bears a replica of the Zionist Youth badge and the words "Kofer Hayis
