

JEWISH WAR RELIEF.

The plight of the Jews in the war zones is so distressing that something will have to be done within the near future to alleviate their present intolerable circumstances, if they are to be saved from death by starvation. War relief means nothing more than the supply of the bare essentials of life.

The manner in which assistance is rendered to Jews in the zones of war is controlled by the Joint Distribution Committee and the Ort-Oze. These are Jewish institutions with representatives in nearly every country in the If necessary these bodies can even negotiate with Governments. They organise the collection of funds and the distribution In order to achieve this, delegates are sent to the actual country where the war is being waged; local committees are arranged on the spot to control the distribution of food. The Jewish Distribution Committee and the Ort-Ose were formed during the Great War owing to the prevailing circumstances, and they have been functioning ever since. Millions of lives were saved by simply supplying the necessities of Now again it will be up to the more fortunate Jews to step forward and assist without hesitation, when they will be called upon to do so.

During the last war the Jewish people in Maitland were alert to the agonising position of their brethren overseas and we are pround to state that the local community were the initiators of the Jewish War Relief Fund in South Africa. Over a period of two years a huge sum was contributed by Maitland Jewry, who bore its share of the burden very admirably. The funds were raised by means of concerts, bazaars, raffles, etc., etc., and as can be well understood this entailed much public-spirited work.



COMMITTEE MEETING.


At a committee meeting on 26th September

Sir,

I have been wondering to what extent Zionism would be affected by the war, consequent-

ly I read with interest in your Rosh Hashanah

number your leader entitled "The War".

My first impression was that you were adopting a selfish attitude. How can we even contemplate doing Zionist work when our country is at war? Are not all our resources needed to bring this greater war to a successful end? Our Zionist efforts would be so much waste of time and energy if Germany won the war. Time and energy which might have been used against Germany rather than to foster our own selfish ends. That was my first impression.

But on reconsidering the position so far as we in South Africa are concerned, the war has not affected us directly and we are still leading normal lives. Why then should we not carry on with our Zionist activities? Then when the war is over we will not have to start rebuilding afresh. That was my second impression.

Finally I concluded that while we are not being directly affected by the war we should proceed with our Zionist work. But Zionism must take second place when the call comes to render assistance to South Africa. When this
