

## The Debutante Ball in Port Elizabeth Organized by Fonda Dubb, Chairman of the Toynbee Ballet School 1970.

During the 70's I volunteered teaching ballet to Coloureds at the Gelvandale Ballet School in Port Elizabeth. The policy of Apartheid failed to provide cultural services to all citizens equally which meant that the Gelvandale initiative had to be mostly supported by the community itself, the Welfare Department and by volunteers.

In addition to actually teaching ballet and in order to advance the School's expansion and thus provide a venue for the local population to use and enjoy, as the Chairman, I undertook the task of fundraising. This included organizing cake sales and Movie Premiers in the City of Port Elizabeth. The money raised was used for buying ballet shoes and costumes for the pupils. It was clear that the funds from these sources, were only a start..







Dulcie Howes, the Inspector of our School, declared that the Coloured Affairs Department would consider a grant, but that first, we needed to fundraise ourselves, in order to show our commitment.

Being prompted by her, I decided to organize a Debutante Ball since I had some experience in doing the same for the Theodore Herzl School in Port Elizabeth where debutantes curtsied to Judge Adleson; so in the light of this experience, I undertook doing this for Coloureds in Gelvandale.

It was quite an undertaking!

We needed to start from scratch, arranging the venue, raising funds, sewing the outfits for the debutantes, organizing transport for the girls, their escorts and the workers. There was work to be done behind the scenes making sure that the event be up to standard as a memorable and prestigious affair. The debutantes rehearsed for several weeks and the excitement and enthusiasm was palpable. My late husband, Mark, put in countless hours of work, being the handyman, taxi-driver and my chief advisor.

Fortunately, my mother-in-law, Ada Dubb, married to Louis Dubb an ex-Mayor of Port Elizabeth, also stepped in!! She was a prominent figure in Port Elizabeth. By putting together a brochure advertising local businesses, the Jewish community business men as well as the community in general, donated generously.

Thanks to this initiative, vital additional funds were raised for the maintenance and advancement of the Gelvandale Toynbee Ballet School.





This was the first Debutante Ball held for the population other than White during the Apartheid era! I felt that justice had been done...

Dulcie Howes, Principal of the Cape Town University Ballet School was full of praise for our project, but thought there should have been photos of the students from the Ballet School in the brochure. I regret to this day that we had overlooked this!! However, we did receive the grant we so badly needed!! Dulcie Howe's dream had become a reality.

I do feel proud that together with my late mother-in-law Ada Dubb, my team of helpers and the beautiful debutantes, that we achieved our goal. As a result, many of our students who are now ballet teachers were able to attend the University of Cape Town Ballet School. Two of these graduates teach Ballet as a Matric subject in schools in Gelvandale in Port Elizabeth.


People have often asked me why it was so important to me to organize something on this large scale.


My answer is a simple one:
