Deep Fakes and the Moon Landing in 1969 by Harry Friedland

I had a very strange experience while watching a Fox News TV newscast yesterday, 8th March.

Two people, first a man and then a woman, were interviewed in quick succession. Neither interview lasted very long. This was heart-stopping stuff. The exercise was planned to take three days.

We were in Standard 8. We asked for a meeting with some of our teachers. We told them how desperately we wanted to record the entire three days by using two tape recorders. We planned to sleep in shifts, to manage the tape recorders. Would they therefore please give us three days off from school to conduct this exercise? Remember, we're talking about epoch-making world history here.

The answer was *no*, you cannot take three days off from school to carry out this exercise. We responded instantly. As one, we said to them that despite their prohibition, we were going to do it anyway. Do your worst. Any punishment would still be worth it.

And we did it. We actually captured every second of the VOA relay, and we kept those tapes for years. Eventually we discovered that you could simply buy commercial recordings of the whole event, and then there was the book, which I bought, of course.

So you can tell me that the whole thing was faked if you like, and I'll tell you where you can put it!
